Enter Meeting on Mute, un-mute during open meeting time

Mute for start of service, un-mute when it's your turn to contribute

When singing the psalm, or leading a prayer, wait for response before you begin.

Here are the readings for Sunday; they can also be found at lectionarypage.net.

Take a nice breath and relax, then start the reading. Take another breath, choose your ending statement and say it, wait a second (not much more) and say "Thanks be to God."

First Reading

A reading from the Book of Jonah

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Second Reading

A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

I mean, brothers and sisters, the appointed time has grown short; from now on, let even those who have wives be as though they had none, and those who mourn as though they were not mourning, and those who rejoice as though they were not rejoicing, and those who buy as though they had no possessions, and those who deal with the world as though they had no dealings with it. For the present form of this world is passing away.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

Opening sentences are chosen from pp. 75-78 - Jeff will choose one to say after the hymn

Confession/Absolution –Jeff

Apostles' Creed – Mike

Joanne will take the Lord's Prayer

Suffrages will be sung or read

Collects

Collect for the Third Sunday after Epiphany

Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Jeff will read at least two collects – the one for Sundays at the bottom of p. 98, and the one for the Sunday printed above. Any other collects can also be added – Renewal of Life, Peace, Grace, or Guidance, or other prayers from pp. 814-835 – but these are optional. May be sung or said.

Prayer for Mission

Jeff chooses from one of the 3 prayers at the bottom of p. 100 or the top of 101. May be sung or said, to match the collects.

Sermon or Homily goes here, if desired
